Every day (on average across the nation) three emergency responders are struck and injured at the scene of a roadside emergency that they have been dispatched to, some suffering life-long, career-ending injuries. As if those injuries are not sobering enough, as of February 17, six responders have been struck and killed by a passing motorist in 2021. In 2019, 44 emergency responders were struck and killed, and in 2020, 46 were struck and killed including two Pennsylvania responders: Paramedic Matthew Smelser (43) and firefighter/tow operator Tyler Laudenslager (29).

As an agency that responds to hundreds of incidents that occur on roadways (traffic accidents and medical emergencies) these struck by incidents concern us. We, like all responders just want to go home at the end of our shift. And we believe the key to reducing these tragedies is educating the motoring public.

On April 27, 2021 Pennsylvania's Move Over law is fully in effect. This law, an updated enhanced version of the Steer Clear law provides for several deterrent consequences that the previous law did not address, such as a directive to move over at least one full lane of travel when passing an accident or work scene, and to try to slow down at least 20 mph below the posted speed limit. But a law can not truly prevent these tragedies. It is an action by the motorist that is required.

Northwest EMS Community Outreach Manager Lori Shenk, who also serves as co-chair of the Public Education and Outreach Committee for Penn TIME (Pennsylvania's Traffic Incident Management Enhancement team), has been working with responders and state and local officials across the Commonwealth on awareness and education initiatives. One of those initiatives is the production of a state-wide Public Service Announcement (PSA) to be released in advance of the law's implementation. The hope is that the PSA will promote awareness of these tragedies and encourage practical application by motorists to SLOW DOWN and MOVE OVER as they pass these working scenes.

On Saturday, March 27 the Manheim Auto Auction (Penn Township) was scheduled to be the site of filming for the PSA which included dozens of responders from all disciplines, with more than 100 pieces of apparatus. This production event was not open to the public, but it was an opportunity to pay tribute to responders who tragically lost their lives in a struck/killed incident and to honor those responders who have been struck and injured. Most importantly it was an opportunity to create an impactful message that we hope will save lives. We hope through the release of the PSA to reach every citizen of the Commonwealth with our message to SLOW DOWN and MOVE OVER when passing a scene where responders are working. The PSA can and will be used on a variety of media platforms including social media and websites as well as the graphics and messaging can be displayed on billboards and electronic sign boards across the state.

Slow Down and Move Over is more than a slogan. It is a cry for response and call to action. **WE ALL JUST WANT TO GO HOME AT THE END OF OUR SHIFT!**

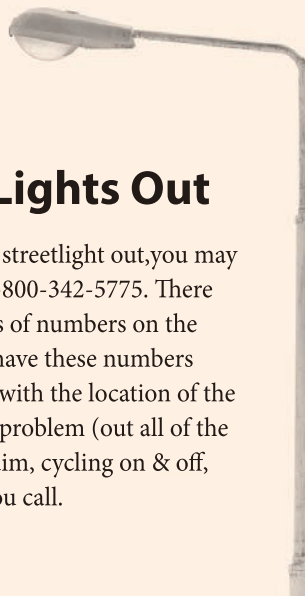

Storm Drains and keeping them free of debris



Storm water becomes a problem when it picks up debris, chemicals, dirt, trash and other pollutants. Storm water travels through a system of pipes and road side ditches that make up the storm sewer systems. It eventually flows directly to a lake, river, stream, wetland or coastal water. All of the pollutants storm water carries along the way also empty into the waters because storm water is not treated.

Grass clippings and leaves are very common pollutants in the storm drains. Please refrain from allowing your grass or any other pollutants (including water from swimming pools) to enter the storm drains. Reminders will be sent to residents throughout the year wherever there are excess amounts of pollutants entering the storm drains.

Tags for the appliances and tires are purchased at the Township Office. Appliances (washers, dryers, stoves, dish washers, freezers, refrigerators, dehumidifiers, air-conditioners, hot water heaters, etc.) are \$12.00 each. Tire tags are \$2.00 each. Rims are \$2.00 each. When purchasing a tag, you will need to give your street address and identify the item you are putting out for pickup. Appliances/tires must be out the night before the pickup date.

Just because something says flushable, it does not mean it is biodegradable.

Nothing should be flushed into the sewer system except the normal amount of human waste and the appropriate amount of toilet paper. It costs the Sewer Authority thousands of dollars to unclog the systems. Under the Pennsylvania Governmental Immunity Statute, the (Township) has limited legal responsibility for sewer and water backups into buildings. Additionally, a backup may be caused completely by an issue in your part of the sewer/water system. You should contact your homeowner's insurance company to determine if you carry coverage for sewer and water backup under your homeowners policy.

Trash/Recycling:



- Place trash & recycling curbside the night before your pickup day.
- Place trash/recycling where it is easily visible for pick up.
- Trash is limited to three bags.
 - Each bag maximum 32 gallon; weighing 30 lbs. or less.
- **Additional bags** must be tagged as **extra trash (\$1.00)** each or they will not be picked up.
- **Bags over 30lbs.** must have bulk item tag (\$3.00) each.
- **Larger items** must have bulk item tag (\$3.00) each. Call to find out if item is acceptable.
- **Appliance (\$12.00) / Tire (\$2.00) / Rims (\$2.00)** pick up is twice a year.
- **Yard waste** is to be in the brown bags with green tags (\$1.00) each (see calendar)
- **No Construction debris** is permitted in trash.
- **No Household hazardous waste** in the trash.
- **No yard waste** is permitted in trash during yard waste season.
- **No burning of trash or yard waste** is permitted at any time.
- Tags for extra trash, bulk items, tires, appliances, yard waste are purchased at the Township building.

*Notes on Recycling:

- There is a dumpster for corrugated cardboard located at the Township Building. If your corrugated cardboard does not fit into your bin take it to the cardboard dumpster.
 - Recycling is mandatory for everyone in the Township including farms and businesses.
 - If it is not on the list do NOT put it in the bin or the bin becomes trash.
 - Do not put cardboard out if it is raining or windy.
 - **Do not put plastic bags in the recycling bin for any reason.**
 - Recycle plastic bags at the grocery store.
 - Do not put recycling out on windy days.
- *For as much as we want you to recycle, we have to say please do not contaminate the recycling process: when in doubt, throw it out.*

If your trash or recycling is missed call the office. If you are calling after hours leave a message. If your trash was not out when the trucks go by it is not considered missed.

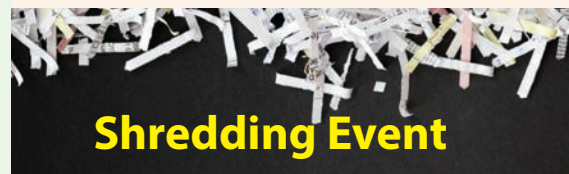

Shredding Event

There will be a limit of four bags or boxes of paper to shred per property.

Anyone participating in this event is asked to bring donations of canned or boxed food items (monetary donations also accepted) to be given to local food banks. Please no perishable or expired items. All items should be in unopened containers. Glass, frozen foods, fresh produce/meats, or home-made foods cannot be accepted here. Your support of the food banks is appreciated by those in need in our community.

WHAT GOES IN THE BIN?

- 1. Corrugated Cardboard**
 - a. Packing & shipping boxes with fluted sheet. (must be dry)
- 2. Plastic Bottles & Jugs**
 - a. Only plastic with a neck.
- 3. Metal Food & Beverage Cans**
 - a. Food & beverage cans (aluminum, steel, tin).
- 4. Glass Food & Beverage Bottles & Jars**
 - a. Clear, green & brown glass bottles & jars.



Tips to Recycle Right

- Remove lids & discard them
- **No plastic bags** in the bin (recycle at the store)
- Items must be empty & rinsed out
- No other materials than listed are to be put in the bin
- **Flatten cardboard** (no grease or food on boxes)

Do not put oil containers or containers that held poisons such as herbicides or insecticides in the bin. WHEN IN DOUBT, THROW IT OUT!



Township Undertakes Preparation of Chickies Creek Day Use Area Master Plan

East Donegal Township is currently in the process of developing a master plan for Chickies Creek Day Use Area. The park, located on Long Lane, was acquired from the Lancaster County Parks Department in 2015.

The purpose of the master plan is to establish a long-term vision for improvements and/or enhancements of the existing park. The planning efforts will be based upon the collaboration and cooperation of municipal officials and the community at large. A consulting team headed by YSM Landscape Architects has been retained to work with the Township for the preparation of the master plan.

A master plan is a conceptual layout for a site. It looks at placement and relationships of facilities, plans for implementation, and acknowledgement of future growth. According to Pennsylvania Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, the master site plan is generally viewed as a research, public input and



an analysis process that leads to a size, type and location plan for the potential development or redevelopment of a park site and potential uses of a park site.

The plan will meet all current standards and provide for the identified recreation needs and priorities of the community to the extent possible. This means that there must be enough detail developed during the process and provided in the plan narrative report and on the plan drawing to ensure that the facilities meet standards, can in fact be built on the site and that reasonably accurate costs can be estimated.

To provide guidance to the consultants, the Township has created a Plan Study Committee. The Committee members are serving in a volunteer capacity representing a variety of interests and opinions regarding the redevelopment of the park.

The Committee will meet as scheduled with the consulting team to conduct activities associated with the preparation of the master site plan. The Committee assists in identifying

other stakeholders that can provide input and guidance to the planning process through interviews and focus groups. This input is critical to developing a plan that meets the needs of the community as a whole.

There will be a series of public meetings scheduled throughout the planning process. These public meetings will be advertised and announced. Be sure to watch the Township website for additional information regarding the plan and the upcoming public meetings.

COMPOST FACILITY: KEY FOBs REQUIRED

As of December 1, 2020, the compost facility in Mount Joy is now only accessible with the purchase of a key fob. Applications for a key fob can be found on Mount Joy Borough's website or at the Mount Joy Borough office. The cost of the key fob is \$20.00 per year.

The compost site is continuously monitored by surveillance cameras. To report any abuse of the facility, call the Borough Public Works Department at 717-653-8226. The Mount Joy Police Department will randomly be monitoring the facility and you may be asked to show identification. Any violation of the Rules and Regulations will result in loss of access to the facility. Please follow the directional signage and place all items in the designated areas. Separate Woody Waste (tree trunks, limbs, branches) from yard waste (leaves, green plants, garden waste).

Tree branches must be less than 19 inches in diameter and less than 8 feet in length.

NO rocks, stones, grass clippings, tree stumps, trash, garbage, construction or demolition waste, painted wood, pressure treated wood, railroad ties, landscaping timbers or plastic bags for any reason. No smoking on the property.

Unacceptable use of the Facility (Resulting in loss of Access)

- Use of your key fob by someone else not on your property.
- Dropping off any items not accepted by the facility.
- Damage to gates, signs, buildings, or any other property damage.
