## **East Donegal Township Joins in Forming Regional Authority to Solve EMS Crisis**

After a year-long cooperative process, eight municipalities in Northwest Lancaster County including East Donegal Township have incorporated a first-of-its-kind regional municipal authority to address our local emergency medical services crisis.

The new Municipal Emergency Services Authority of Lancaster County will fund, manage and provide EMS services in the eight municipalities. The founding municipalities are Conoy Township,

East Donegal Township, Elizabethtown Borough, Elizabeth Township, Marietta Borough, Mount Joy Township, Penn Township and West Donegal Township.



The path to forming the authority began in 2018, when municipalities in northwest Lancaster County were at a crossroads with the future of emergency services at risk.

Northwest EMS in northwest Lancaster County, which was recognized as Pennsylvania EMS Agency of the Year in 2020 by the Pennsylvania Emergency Health Services Council, was facing insolvency due to insufficient revenue and rising costs. Many EMS agencies across the state are also struggling to maintain services in the face of soaring costs, funding shortfalls and staffing challenges.

East Donegal Township and other municipalities in the region needed a bold solution to continue to meet their statutory obligation to ensure EMS readiness to answer the call.

#### How did the municipalities arrive at this solution?

At the start of 2021, a committee of local municipal leaders began studying the situation and exploring alternatives. Upon conducting an analysis, the committee arrived at the creation of a municipal authority as the best path to fund and provide EMS readiness and services on a regional basis.

Over a period of several months, the committee engaged in municipal public meetings, additional public education initiatives and a public hearing on the proposed solution. The process culminated in eight municipalities in the region enacting ordinances to form the Municipal Emergency Services Authority of Lancaster County. # Storm Drains and keeping them free of debris



Storm water becomes a problem when it picks up debris, chemicals, dirt, trash and other pollutants. Storm water travels through a system of pipes and road side ditches that make up the storm sewer systems. It eventually flows directly to a lake, river, stream, wetland or coastal water. All of the pollutants storm water carries along the way also empty into the waters because storm water is not treated.

Grass clippings and leaves are very common pollutants in the storm drains. Please refrain from allowing your grass or any other pollutants (including water from swimming pools) to enter the storm drains. Reminders will be sent to residents throughout the year wherever there are excess amounts of pollutants entering the storm drains.

#### TRASH SCHEDULE

Tuesday trash day- all roads west of Colebrook Road and Old Colebrook Road Wednesday trash day — all roads east of Colebrook Road including Colebrook & Old Colebrook Roads.

Occasionally the trash will be delayed a day or cancelled until the following week. if the trash is to be picked up the following week, double the amount of normal trash may be put out for pick up. Anyone signed up to receive Township e-mails will be notified by e-mail of any changes.

#### APPLIANCE/TIRE PICKUP APRIL 25 & 26

Tags for appliances and tires are purchased at the Township Office. Appliances (washers, dryers, stoves, dishwashers, freezers, refrigerators, dehumidifiers, air-conditioners, hot water heaters, etc.) are \$15.00 each. Tire tags are \$4.00 each. Rims

are \$4.00 each. When purchasing a tag, you will need to give your street address and identify the item you are putting out for pickup. Appliances/tires must be out the night before the designated pickup date.

# **Let's Talk About Construction Permits**

#### "When do I need a Construction Permit?"

Since the purpose of any construction code is to protect the health, safety and welfare of the residents, most home projects undertaken will require some type of permit.

Zoning and/or Construction Permits are generally required under three circumstances:

- For a change in the use or occupancy in nonresidential structures
- For all new construction
- For all modifications, renovations and/or alterations of existing structures and/or equipment as required.

Some of the more common instances where Zoning and/or Construction Permits are required are:

- When one business moves out of a building and another business moves in.
- New construction
- Construction or reconstruction of a deck or balcony
- Finishing a previously unfinished basement or attic



#### How will the authority work and what will I have to pay?

The Municipal Emergency Services Authority of Lancaster County will be governed by a board consisting of a representative from each of the authority's founding municipalities. The board will be responsible for determining the authority's services and fees.

Instead of generating operating revenue through voluntary municipal and membership contributions (as Northwest EMS does today), the authority will set a reasonable and uniform annual fee to property owners, on par with Northwest EMS subscription rates.

As a regional municipal entity, the authority will hold public hearings, enabling community members to have a voice regarding any changes to services or rates.

#### When will the authority begin operating?

The authority will begin holding board meetings in March. Meetings will be advertised. A list of meeting dates and the meeting location is also posted at SavingEMSforNWLancaster.org.

A public hearing is expected to be held in late summer on the authority's emergency services and fee structure. The authority plans to be operational and begin providing services in 2024.

Recycling in Lancaster County in the bins is as follows:

- Plastic bottles & jugs with necks.
  - o No other plastic!!!!!!!! NO exceptions!!!!!!
- Glass food & beverage jars & bottles
- Metal & bi-metal food & beverage cans
- Corrugated cardboard
  - o No other paper products, paperboard, etc.
  - o Only place cardboard in your bin when it is NOT raining.

Placing containers (bottles/cans) that have not been rinsed out, plastic bags, flowerpots, clam shells, Styrofoam, kids' toys, food, etc. in the recycling bin contaminates the entire truck load of recycling.

\*There is a dumpster located at the Township building for recycling Corrugated cardboard only.

#### A note from LCSWMA:

Some items are recyclable but should **not** go in the bin. Items such as newspapers, cereal boxes and plastic bags may be delivered to local drop-off locations. For a list of locations that accept a variety of other recyclable materials visit earth911.com.

It's okay to throw everything else away. Lancaster County has an advanced waste-to-energy process that converts these materials into renewable energy, powering local homes and businesses and helping to reduce our reliance on non-renewable sources of energy. Reminder: LCSWMA is imposing a \$20.00 penalty for any customers transporting waste to one of their facilities that fail to use a trap to secure open loads.

#### **RAIN GARDEN MAINTENANCE:**

#### What You Need to Know About Rain Gardens and How to Maintain Them.

#### What is a Rain Garden?

A rain garden is a method of treating stormwater by capturing and allowing filtering and settling of sediment and pollutants through plantings and a mulch layer. The root systems of plants enhance infiltration and improve water quality prior to infiltration. See the graphic below of a typical rain garden.


#### What Can I Use a Rain Garden For?

- 1. Reducing runoff volume in your yard.
- 2. Filtering pollutants
- 3. Recharging the groundwater by helping water to infiltrate.
- 4. Improve aesthetics and provide a bird or butterfly habitat.
- 5. Meeting a stormwater management requirement when obtaining a municipal permit for a building, shed, or driveway addition.

#### How do I Maintain my Rain Garden?

- Weed your rain garden regularly.
- Ensure that your rain garden is not collecting leaf, branch, or sedimented debris. If it is clean and dispose of any debris properly.
- Ensure that mulch is reapplied as needed or at a minimum once a year. Mulch does not need to be reapplied in a thick layer. 1 ½ - 2 ½" is enough.
- Trim plantings on an as needed basis. This can be done 1-2 times a year or as needed.
- Replace dead or dying plants as needed.

# **Compost Facility: Key Fobs Required**

The compost facility in Mount Joy is **only** accessible with the purchase of a key fob. Applications for a key fob can be found on Mount Joy Borough's website or at the Mount Joy Borough office. The cost of the key fob is \$30.00 per year.

Please follow the directional signage and place all items in the designated areas. Separate Woody Waste (tree trunks, limbs, branches) from yard waste (leaves, green plants, garden waste). Tree branches must be less than 19 inches in diameter and less than 8 feet in length.

NO rocks, stones, grass clippings, tree stumps, trash, garbage, construction or demolition waste, painted wood, pressure treated wood, railroad ties, landscaping timbers or plastic bags for any reason. No smoking on the property.

Unacceptable use of the Facility (Resulting in loss of Access)

- Use of your key fob by someone else not on your property.
- Dropping off any items not accepted by the facility.
- Damage to gates, signs, buildings, or any other property damage.







The drop-box is anonymous; no questions or requests for identification will be made by law enforcement personnel. to). Drugs should be in a container such as a pill bottle, box, blister pack, or zip lock bag. No needles, aerosols, or biohazard materials may be deposited. Do not put medical equipment, batteries, syringes, or other biohazard waste into the drop-off boxes.

## \*Notes on Recycling:

- There is a dumpster for corrugated cardboard located at the Township Building. If your corrugated cardboard does not fit into your bin take it to the cardboard dumpster.
- Recycling is mandatory for everyone in the Township including farms and businesses.
- If it is not on the list do NOT put it in the bin or the bin becomes trash.
- Do not put cardboard out if it is raining or windy.
- Do not put plastic bags in the recycling bin for any reason.
- Recycle plastic bags at the grocery store.
- Do not put recycling out on windy days.

\*For as much as we want you to recycle, we have to say please do not contaminate the recycling process: when in doubt, throw it out.



### What's New with Water Quality in East Donegal Township

#### **Evans Run Streambank and Buffer Restoration Project**

The proposed streambank restoration project, detailed in both Marietta Borough and East Donegal Township's Chesapeake Bay Pollutant Reduction Plan as part of their MS4 Permits with PA Department of Environmental Protection (DEP), has gone from design and permitting to approved for implementation by DEP and the Lancaster County Conservation District. The East Donegal Township Board of Supervisors approved the bid received my Green Team Industries, LLC to implement the work as detailed on the design plans.

#### What to Expect?

What Township residents should expect for the duration of the project is not much more than business as usual on the Donegal Mutual and GSK sites which straddle the East Donegal Township and Marietta Borough lines. The construction is expected to begin this spring and wrap up before this summer. The construction access will be from Donegal Insurance Group property along N. Waterford Ave. The construction will be visible from N. Waterford Avenue and State Route 441-River Rd. Work will proceed during weekdays and follow normal business hours.

#### Why is This Needed?

This project is needed to satisfy municipal requirements of the PA DEP MS4 permits held by both Marietta and East Donegal. This is also going to provide long term water quality benefits by creating a less erosive stream condition and a more stable stream corridor to handle storm events. Additionally, this will provide abundant opportunities for native plant species, birds, and other wildlife to thrive in this area.



#### Who to Thank

First and foremost, we should thank the property owners, Glaxo Smith Kline (Corixa Corp) and Donegal Insurance Group. Without their generous support of offering their land along Evans Run for these streambank improvements this would not be possible. Their continued commitment to collaboration and enhanced water quality within the Chesapeake Bay Watershed is commendable and we thank them for their support and assistance.

Secondly, thank you to our grantors PA DEP and the Lancaster Clean Water Partners. The project submitted for two grants which will cover the entirety of the cost of the project. Marietta Borough has contributed match money for the PA DEP Growing Greener Grant and East Donegal Township has kicked in the cost of the engineering design and permitting. With the support of these entities this is completely at no cost to Township or Borough residents.
